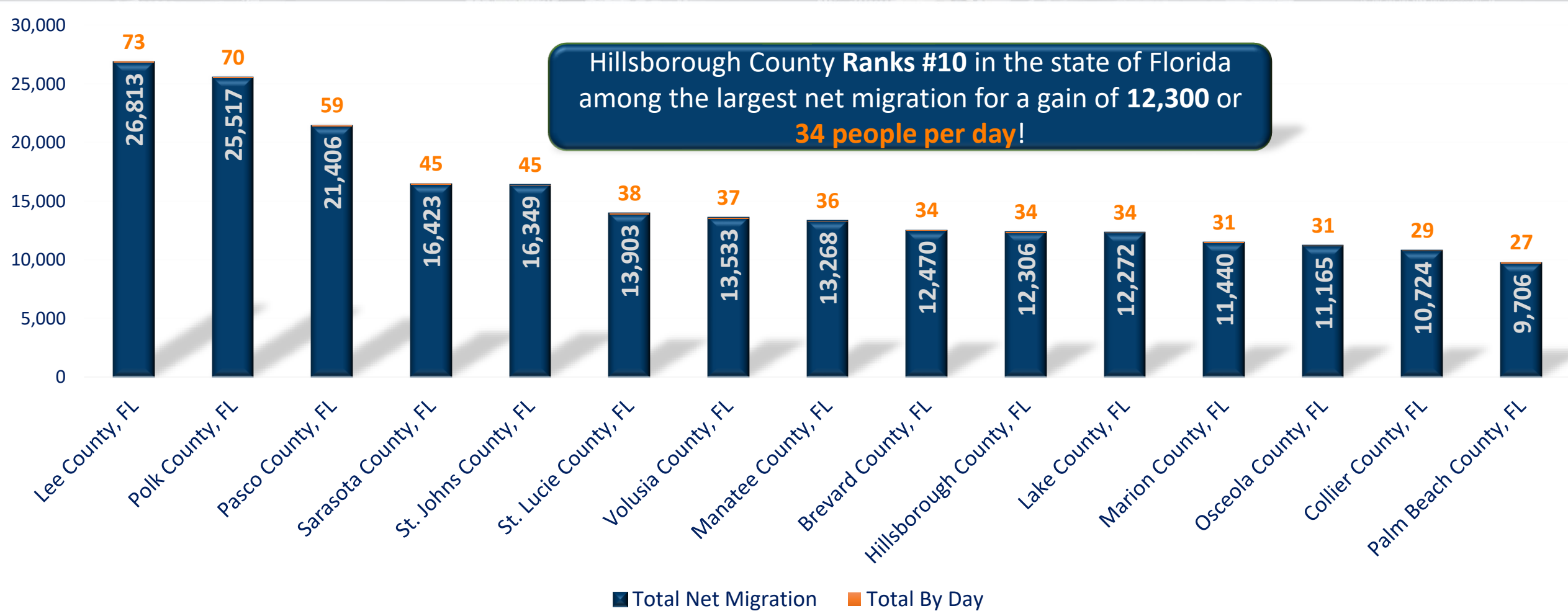
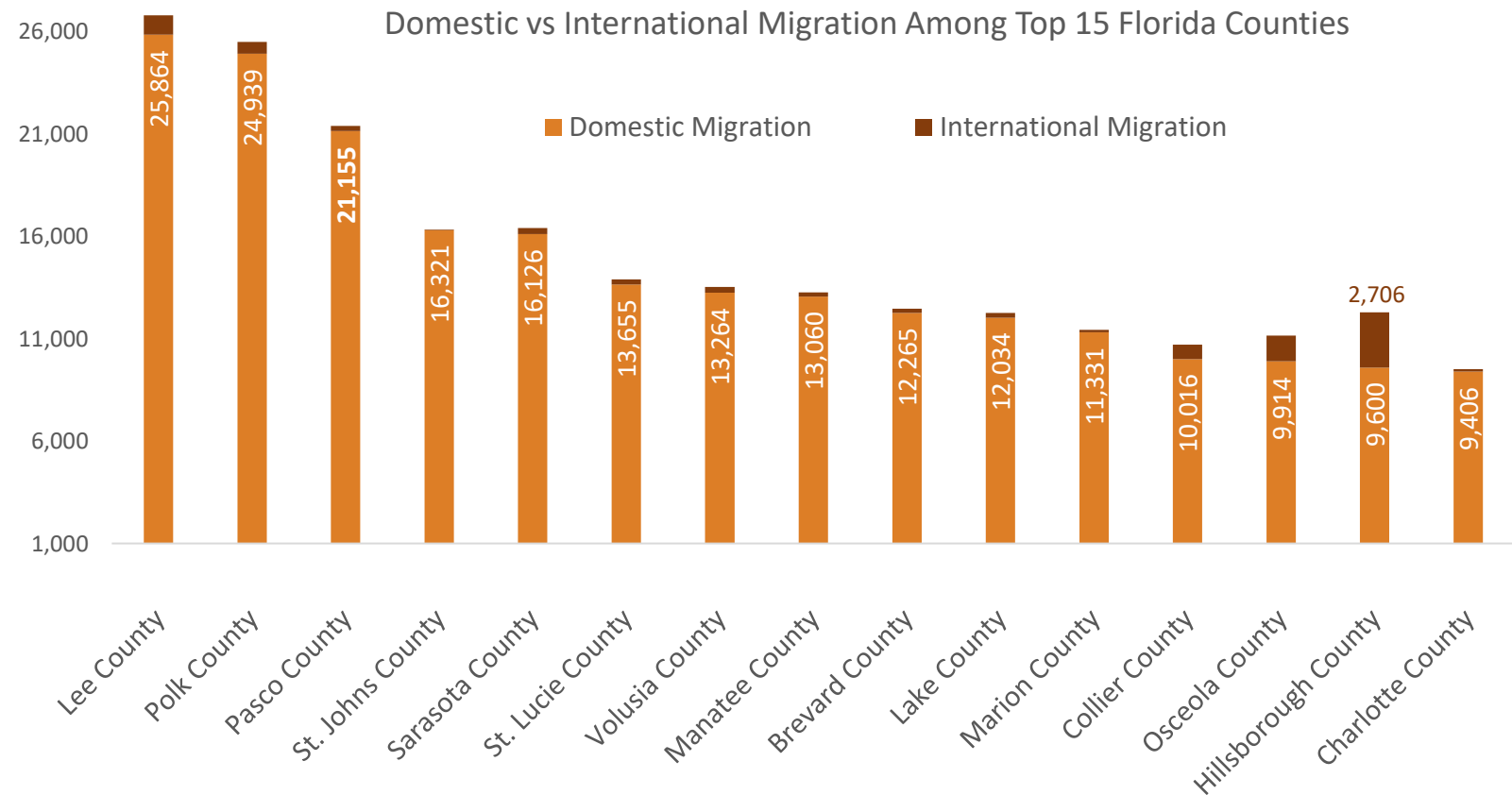


Florida Counties Net Migration



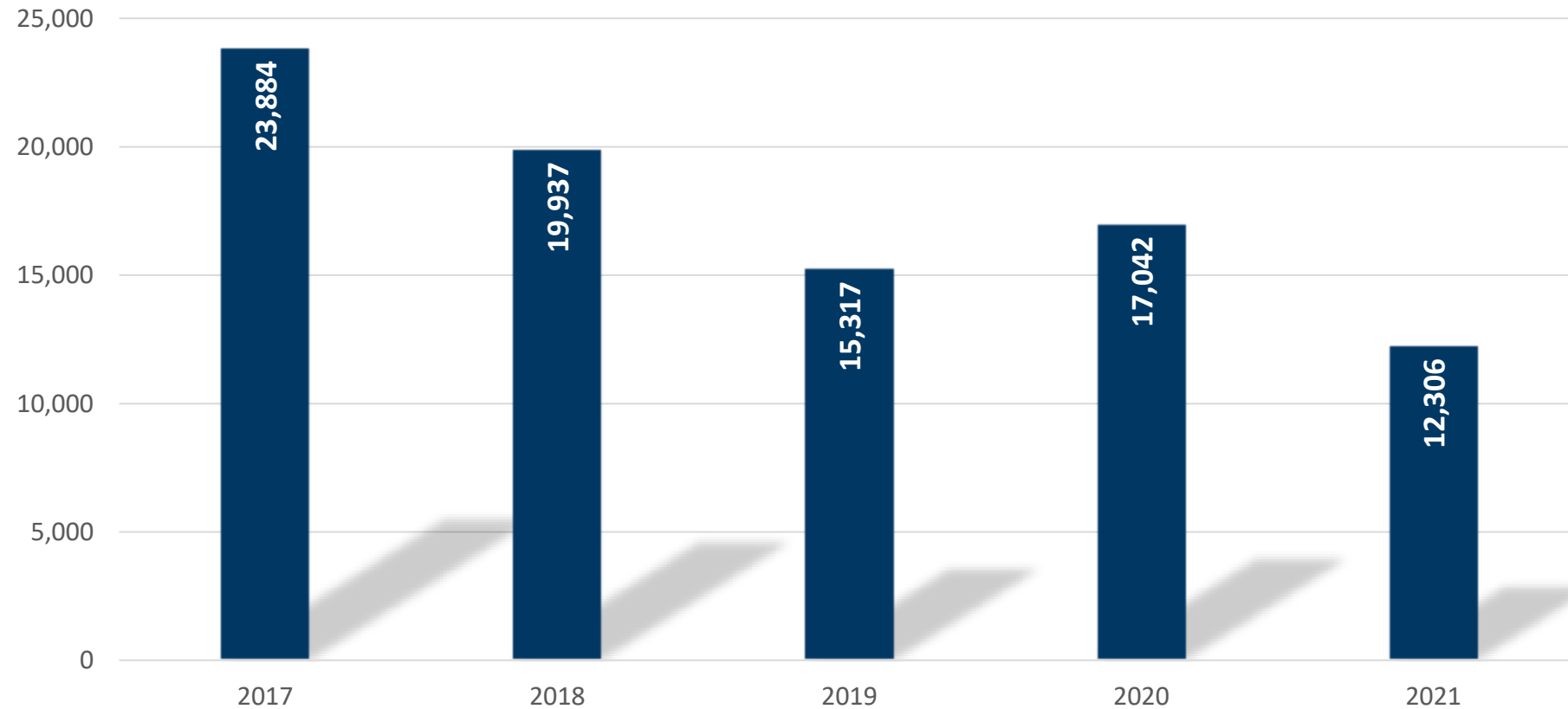
Domestic vs International Migration Among Top Florida Counties

- Domestic and international migration contribute to how an area's population changes over time.
- Net domestic migration is the difference between in-migration (the number of people moving in) and outmigration (the number of people moving out) during a migration period.
- A positive net migration or net in-migration indicates more individuals moved in than out while a negative net migration or net outmigration represents the opposite.
- Hillsborough County ranked among the top 15 Florida counties with the largest domestic migration in the state with **9,600** people moving in and another **2,700** moving within the national boundaries.
- In the state of Florida, Miami-Dade County had the most loss in domestic migration of **-44,800** yet had the largest gain in international migration of 14,200.

Hillsborough County Net Migration Trend

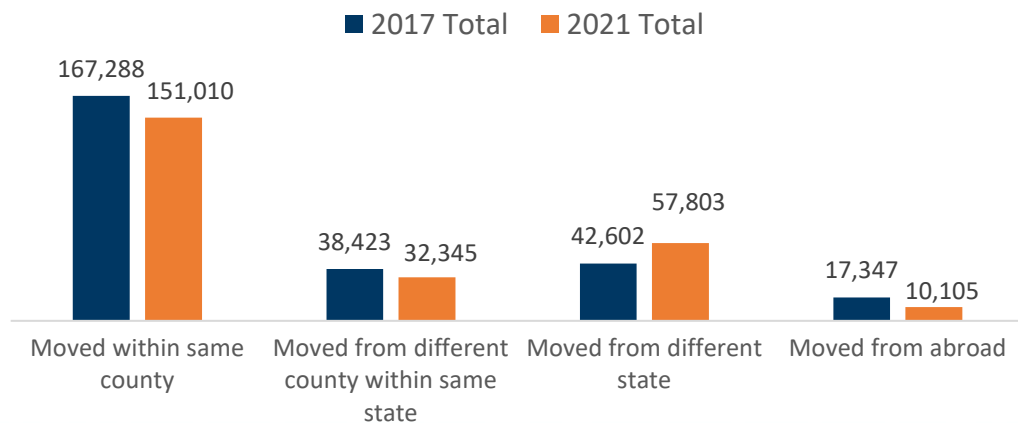


- Hillsborough County saw declines in net migration between 2017 and 2019 due to a loss in domestic and international migration.
- By 2020 there was an 11% increase showing a gain of over 1,700, only to decline in 2021 for a loss of **-28%** or **-4,700**.

Hillsborough County Geographic Mobility

- In 2021 an estimated 1.2 million or 83% of residents lived in the same house one year ago compared 1.1 million or 81% in 2017.
- Out of those residents who did move, 60% or more moved within Hillsborough County.
- The Covid-19 pandemic did not stop movers from crossing state lines. In 2021, more than 57,800 people moved to Hillsborough County from another state.
