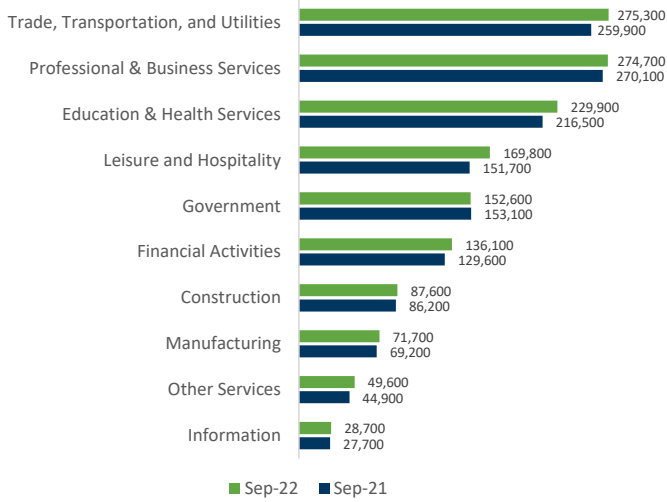
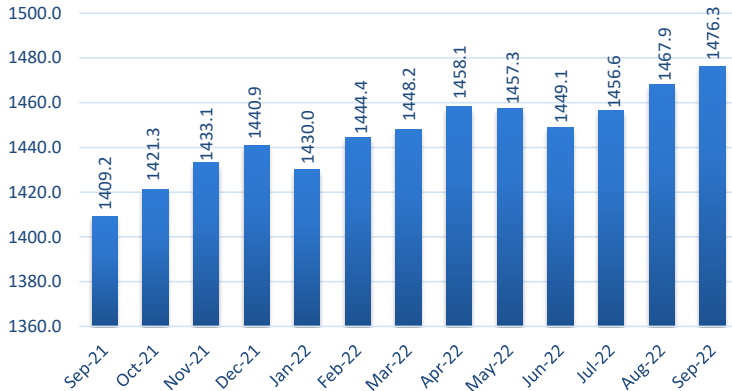


Tampa's total nonfarm payroll employment increased to 67,100 or 4.8% since September 2021. Other Florida metros with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+80,800 jobs, +6.8%) and Orlando (+65,800 jobs, +5.0%). Industries gaining the most jobs in Tampa over last year include leisure and hospitality (+18,100), trade, transportation, and utilities (+15,400), and education and health services (+13,400). Retail trade sector (which is included in trade, transportation, and utilities supersector) added 7,500 jobs year-over-year. Professional and business services, trade, transportation, and utilities and education and health services currently account for 53% of the industry share.

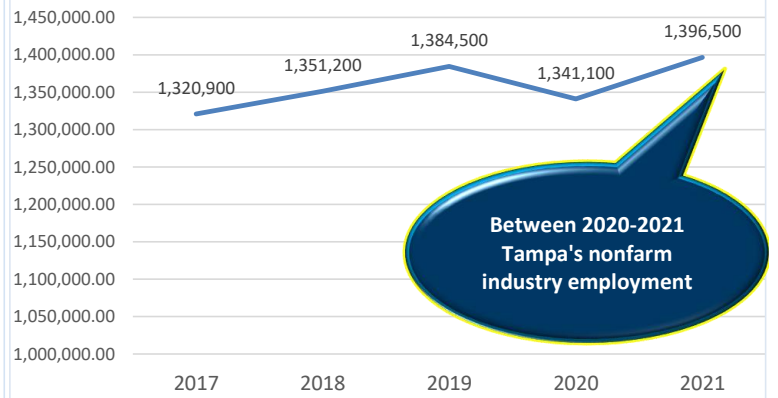
TAMPA MSA INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT YOY



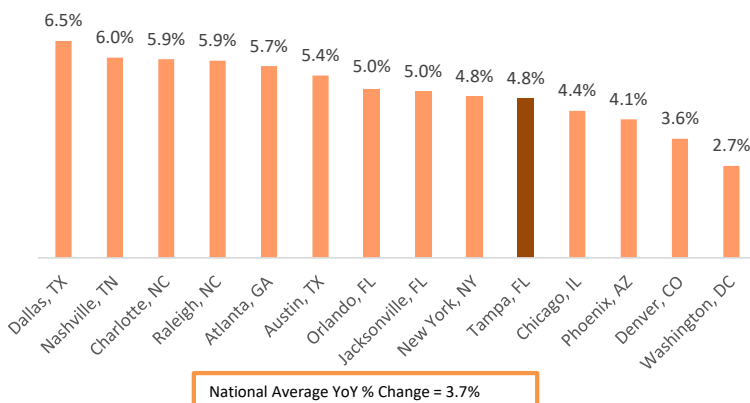
Monthly Total Nonfarm Employment Trend (000)
