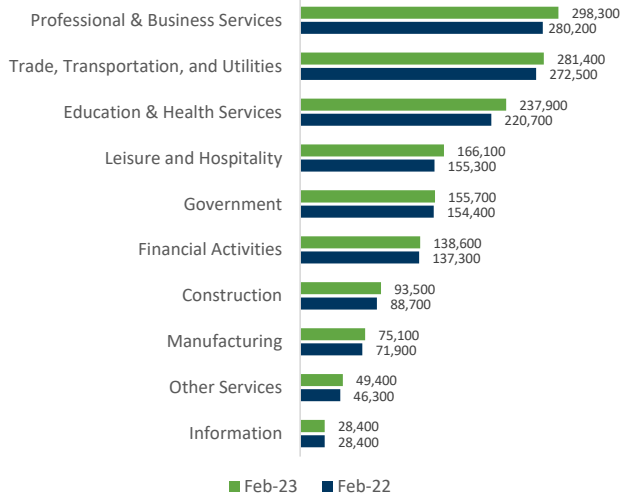
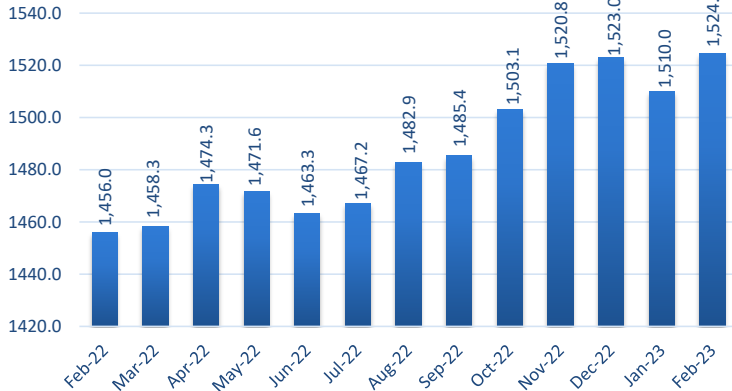


Tampa's total nonfarm payroll employment had the largest increase in the state of Florida 68,700 or 4.7% since February 2022. Other Florida metros with the largest gains were Orlando (+68,300 jobs, +5.0%) and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+53,800 jobs, +4.4%). Industries gaining the most jobs in Tampa over last year include professional and business services (+18,100), education and health services (+17,200), leisure and hospitality (+10,800) and trade, transportation, and utilities (+8,900). Professional and business services, trade, transportation, and utilities, and education and health services currently account for 54% of the industry share. In the past five years, employment in the Tampa MSA grew 9.6% - more than the state of Florida and the nation.

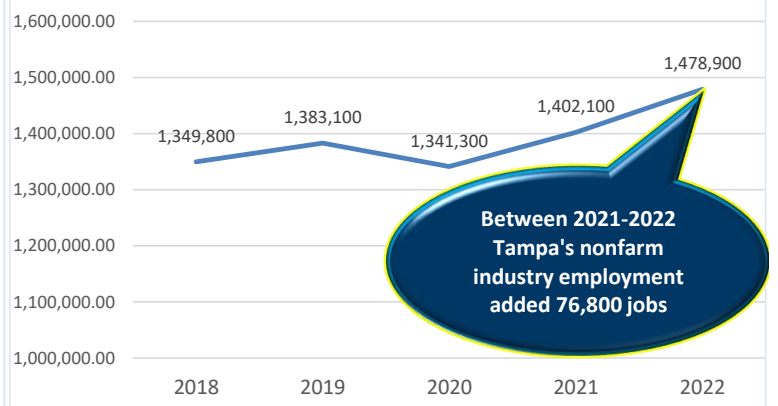
TAMPA MSA INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT YOY



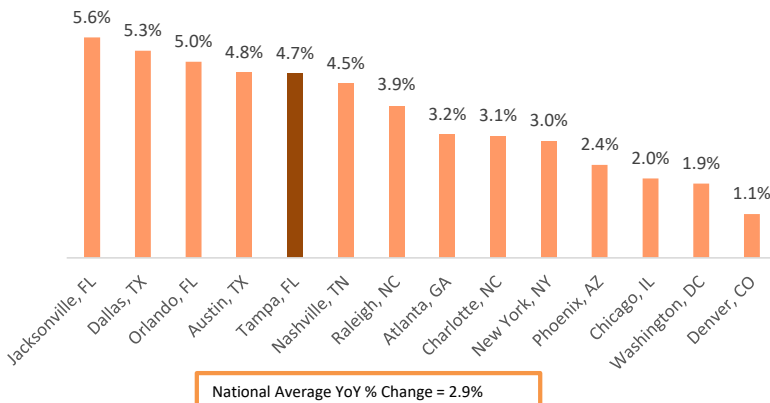
Monthly Total Nonfarm Employment Trend (000)
