The ACS 5-Year Migration Flow

What is the American Community Survey Migration Flow?

- The migration flows are derived from the household and group quarter locations sampled in the American Community Survey (ACS) and the responses to the migration questions on the questionnaire.
- Group quarters include people living in correctional institutions, juvenile detention facilities, nursing homes, other long-term care facilities, college dorms, military facilities and other noninstitutionalized facilities.
- Migration flow refers to residents moving from one geography to another.
- Each year the U.S. Census Bureau releases migration flow tables for selected geographic summary levels based on the ACS 5-year dataset.
- Metro-to-metro migration flow estimates have been produced every 5-years beginning with 2005-2009.
- In addition, the Census also releases a 5-year Migration Flow between Regions within the United States - Northeast, South, Midwest and West.








The South Region Is Where People Are Moving To

People move for many reasons whether it's for a new job, being closer to family or a lower cost of living.

In the Northeast New Yorkers are retiring and moving South which is where more people moved to than any other region during the 2015-2020 Region-to-Region Migration Inflow.

Over half or 55% of the people from the West and Midwest regions moved South.

The smallest percentage or 15% of movers from the other three regions headed to the Northeast.








Population in the Tampa Bay MSA is Growing

- Tampa MSA: Cities of Tampa, St. Petersburg, and Clearwater consists of counties in Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, and Hernando
- 18th largest metro in the U.S.

Tampa MSA Population Trend




Between 2010-2020 population in Tampa MSA grew **14%** and between 2020-2027 it is projected to grow **5%**






Here Are the Top 20 States Residents Are Moving From To Live in the Tampa MSA

Top States Residents Moved From to Tampa MSA






Tampa MSA Gained the Most Residents From these States Between 2015-2019 & 2016-2020 Migration Inflows




Between the 2015-2019 and 2016-2020 ACS 5-Year Migration Inflow:

- Tampa had a net gain of 672 residents from other states within the U.S.
- Texas cited the most net gain with 706 movers followed by District of Columbia (629)






Trend of Top States Residents Moved From To Live in the Tampa MSA

People Are Moving to Low-Tax States

Florida does not have a state individual income tax.

It does have a:

- 5.50 percent corporate income tax.
- 6.00 percent state sales tax rate
- Local sales tax rate of 2.00 percent
- An average combined state and local sales tax rate of 7.02 percent






Primary Reason People Move to Florida

According to the <u>United Van Lines</u> here are some primary reasons why people moved to Florida between 2016 and 2020:

- In 2016, a new job was their #1 reason (37%), followed by retirement (34%).
- By 2020 it reversed to retirement as their #1 reason people moved (39%), followed by a new job (23%).
