



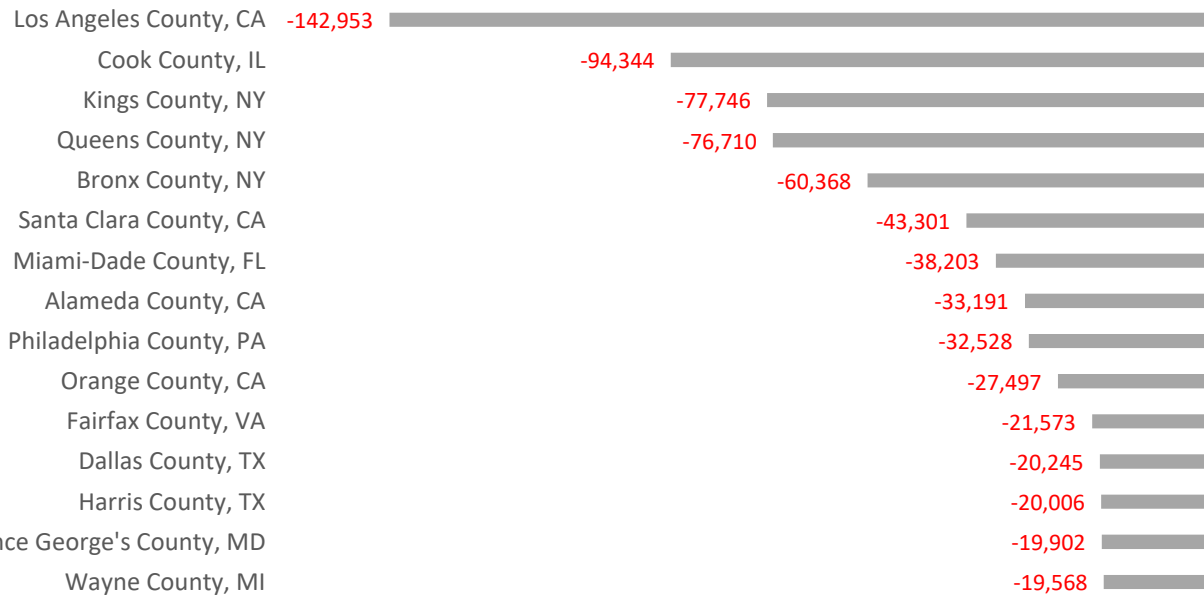

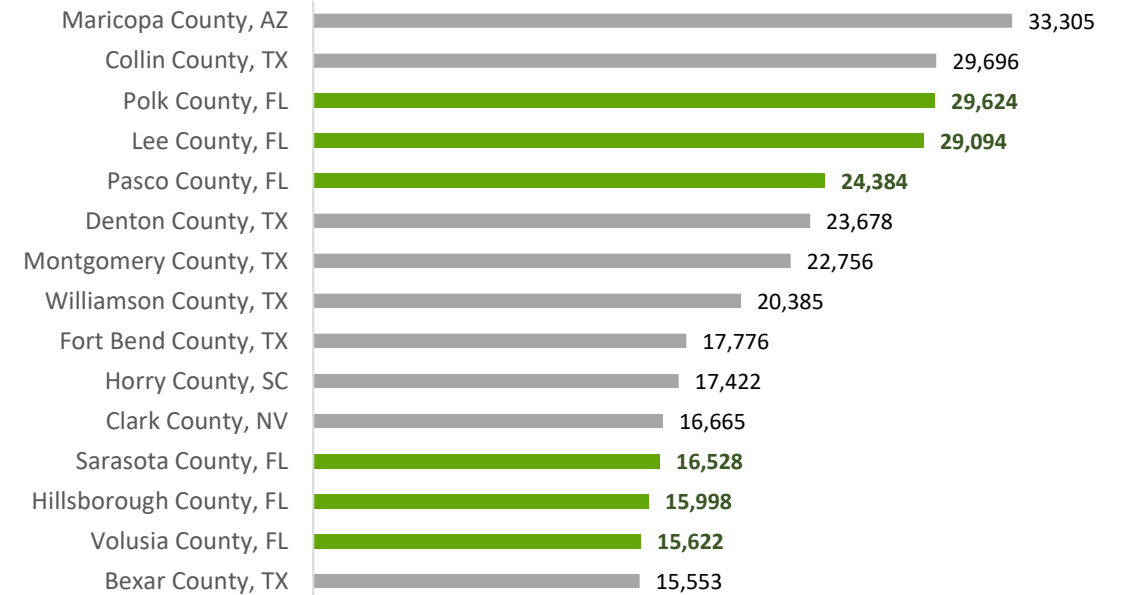
2021-2022 U.S. Counties Domestic Gains versus Loss

- According to the U.S. Census, the patterns of domestic migration in 2022 were notably different than 2021. During the height of the pandemic, many small counties experienced higher levels of domestic migration, while many large counties saw lower levels of domestic migration. This pattern was reversed between 2021 and 2022. Many large counties in the South and West observed an uptick in domestic migration.
- In the West, Los Angeles County in California lost over -142,900 and Santa Clara County lost -43,300 people through domestic migration in 2022. While in the South, six Florida counties (Polk, Lee, Pasco, Sarasota, Hillsborough and Volusia) were among the top counties with the largest domestic migration adding over +131,000 residents combined.

Domestic Migration Loss



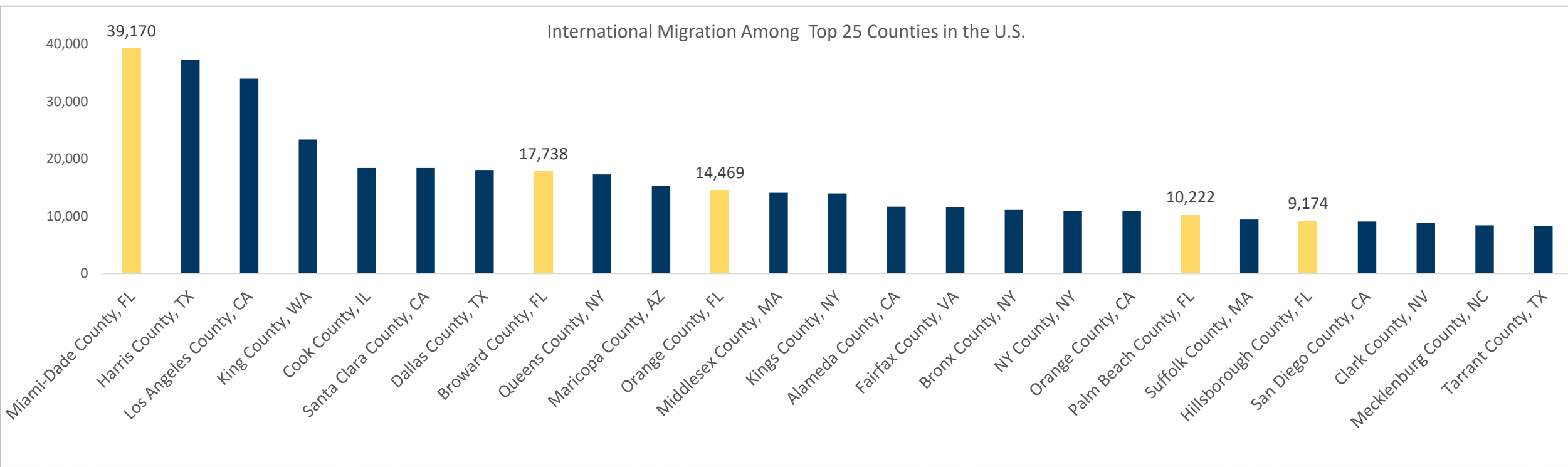
Domestic Migration Gain



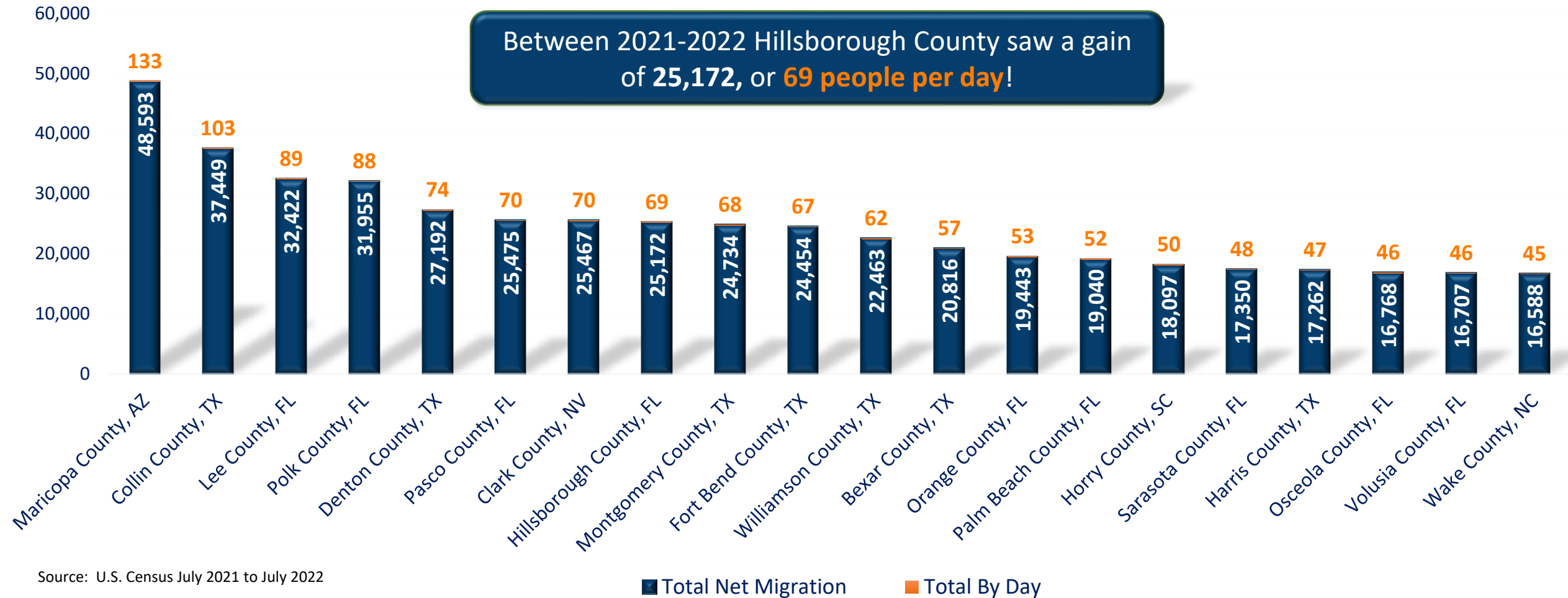
2021-2022 U.S. Counties International Migration Pattern

Net international migration patterns noted five counties from Florida among the top 25 in the U.S with the most international migration. Miami-Dade County ranked #1 in the nation and the state of Florida.

Hillsborough County ranked #21 in the nation and #5 in the state of Florida.

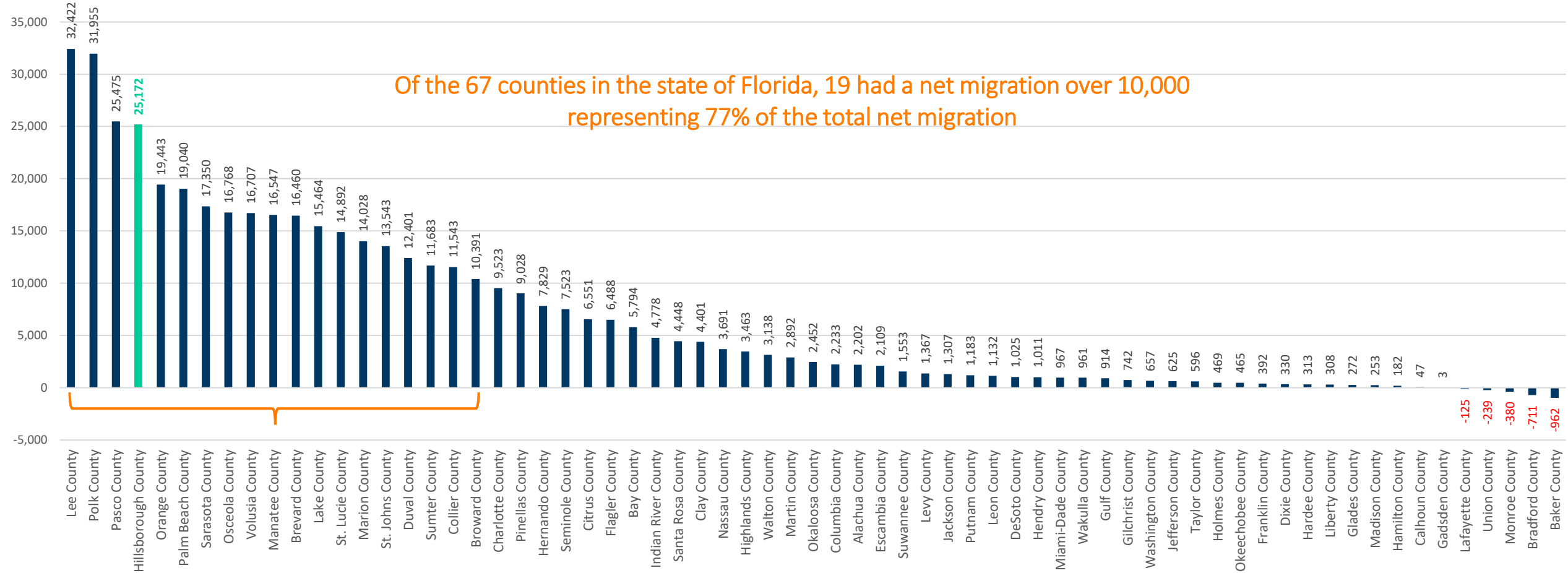


Hillsborough County Ranks 8th in the Nation in Total Net Migration



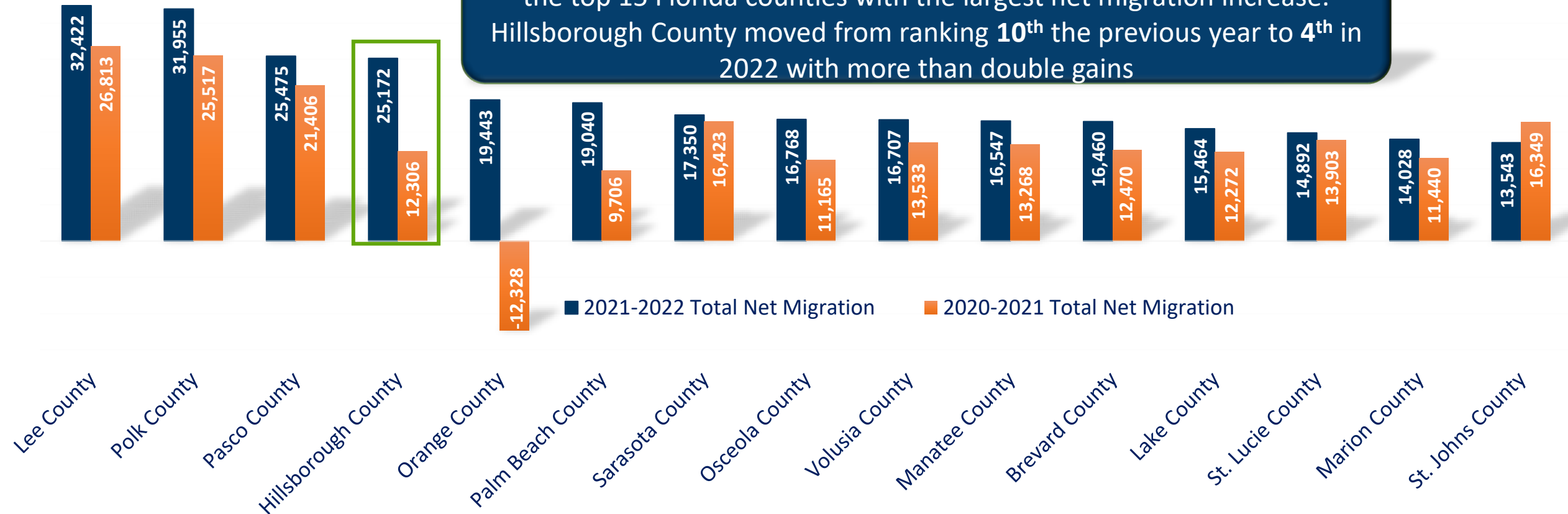
Between July 2021-July 2022 the State of Florida Had the Largest Net Migration of 444,484. Here are the Counties that Experienced this Growth

Three neighboring counties Polk, Pasco and Hillsborough were among the top 15 Florida counties with the largest net migration increase. Hillsborough County moved from ranking 10th the previous year to 4th in 2022 with more than double gains

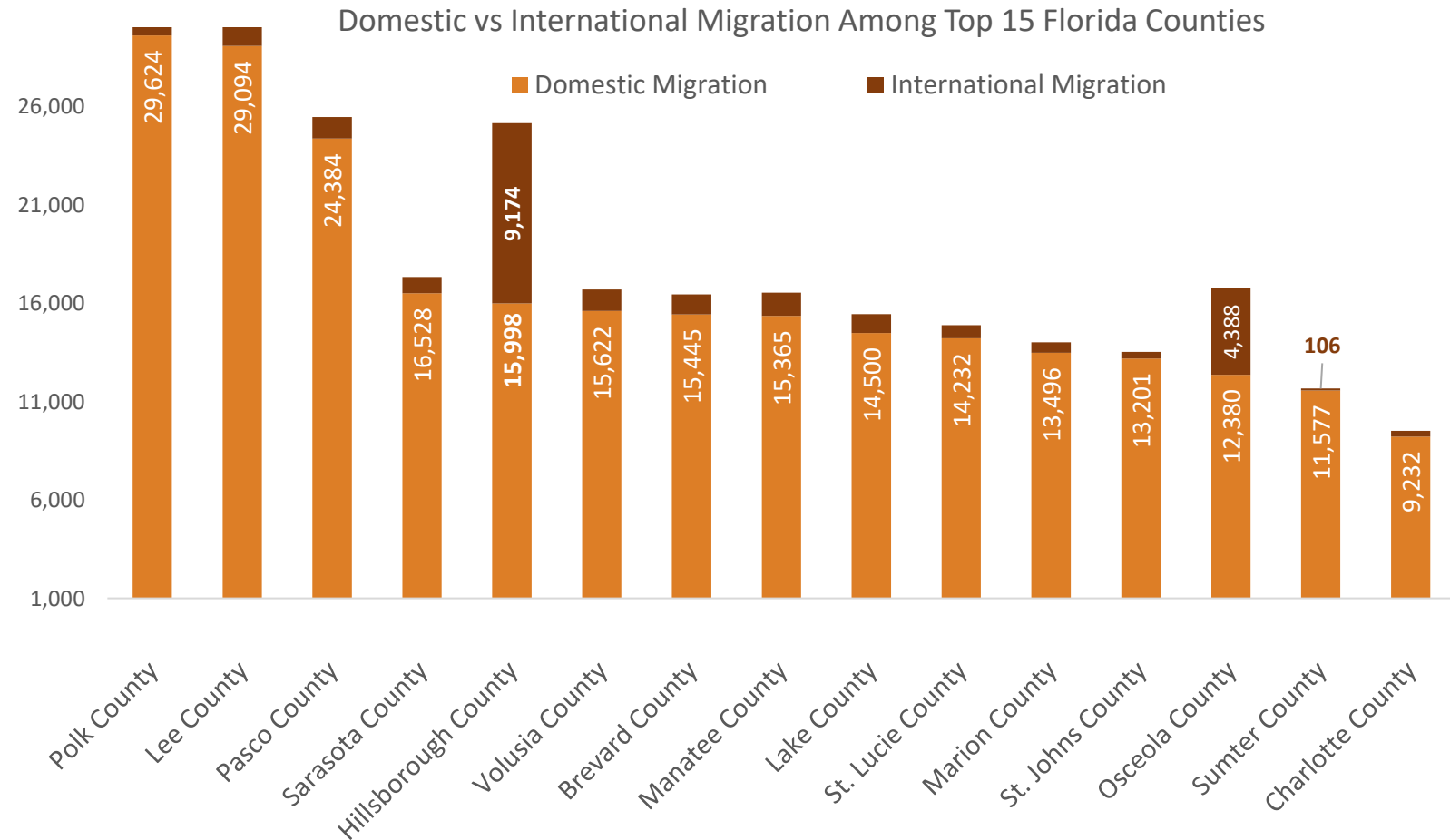

Domestic vs International Migration Among Top Florida Counties

- Domestic and international migration contribute to how an area's population changes over time.
- Net domestic migration is the difference between in-migration (the number of people moving in) and outmigration (the number of people moving out) during a migration period.
- A positive net migration or net in-migration indicates more individuals moved in than out while a negative net migration or net outmigration represents the opposite.
- Hillsborough County ranked **5th** among the top 15 Florida counties with the largest domestic migration in the state with nearly **16,000** people moving in and ranked **5th** in international migration with another **9,100** moving within the national boundaries.
- In the state of Florida, Miami-Dade County had the most loss in domestic migration of **-38,200** yet ranked first with the largest gain in international migration over 39,100.



Hillsborough County 10-Year Migration Trend

- Net migration peaked in 2016 to 26,483 due to the increase in international migration. Then declined to 12,300 in 2021 which was attributed to the international travel ban from the impact of Covid-19. The ban was finally lifted in November 2021. By 2022, net migration saw the second largest increase since 2016.
- In 2015 domestic migration saw a gain in movers of 15,413 then slowly declined. By 2022 saw the highest movement increase in ten years of nearly 16,000.
- International migration rose in 2017 with 11,800 people moving in from abroad. The following year international migration exceeded domestic migration at 10,226 versus domestic 9,711 only to experience a loss of 6,900 by 2021. The following year international migration saw a significant growth of 5,800 for a total of 9,174.
