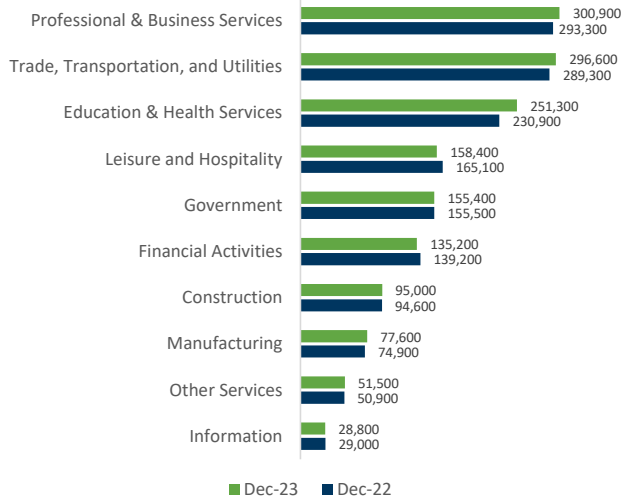
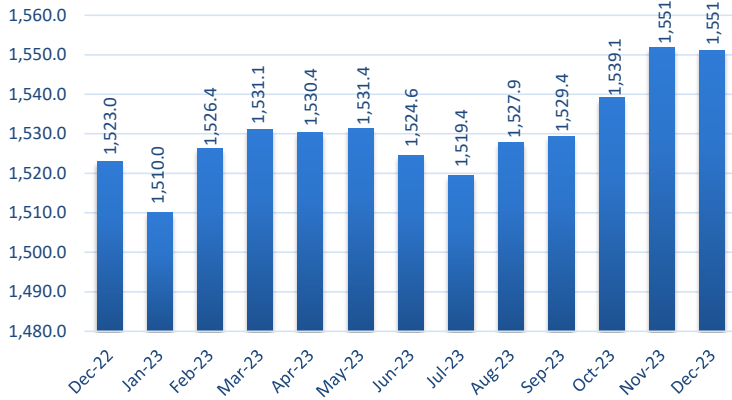


Tampa's total nonfarm payroll employment was among the largest over-the year job gains in the state of Florida adding 28,000 new jobs for a gain of 1.8% since December 2022. Other Florida metros with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+50,600 jobs, +3.9%) and Fort Lauderdale (+33,400 jobs, +3.7%). Industries gaining the most jobs in Tampa over last year include education and health services (+20,400), professional and business services (+7,600) and trade, transportation and utilities (+7,300). Professional and business services, trade, transportation, and utilities, and education and health services currently account for 55% of the industry share. In the past five years, employment in the Tampa MSA grew 9.6% - more than the state of Florida and the nation.

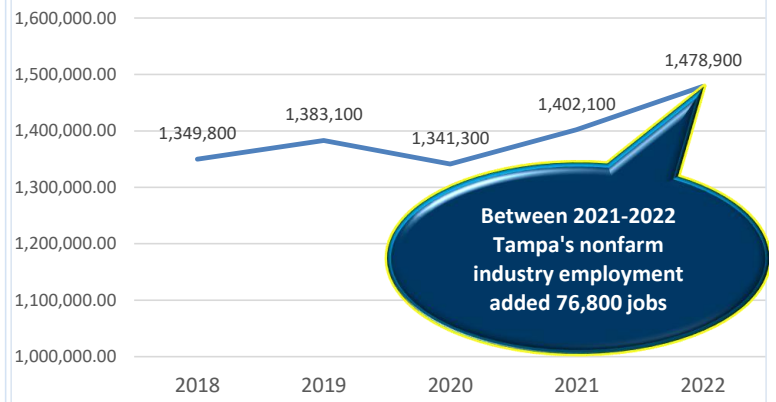
TAMPA MSA INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT YOY



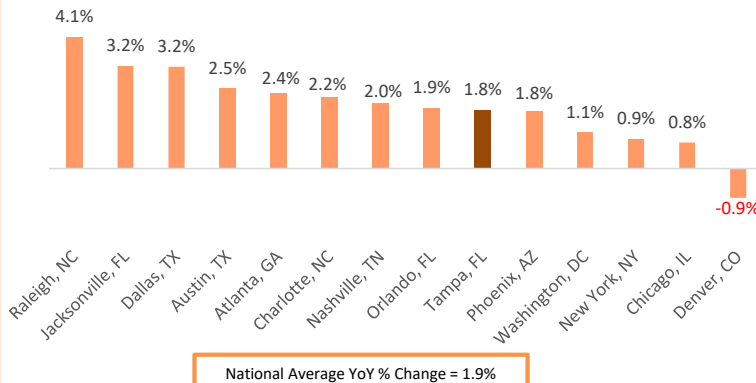
Monthly Total Nonfarm Employment Trend (000)
