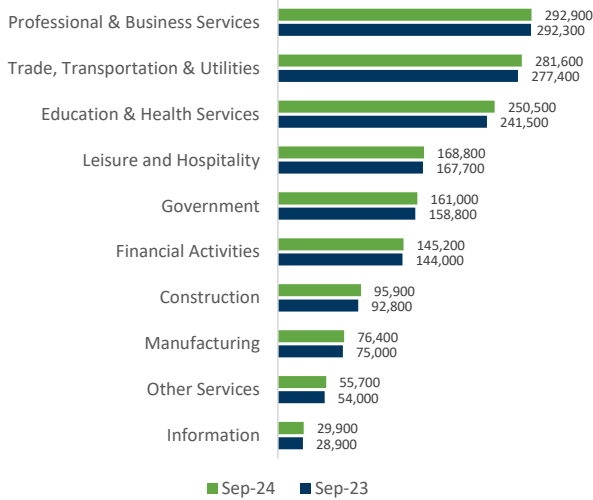
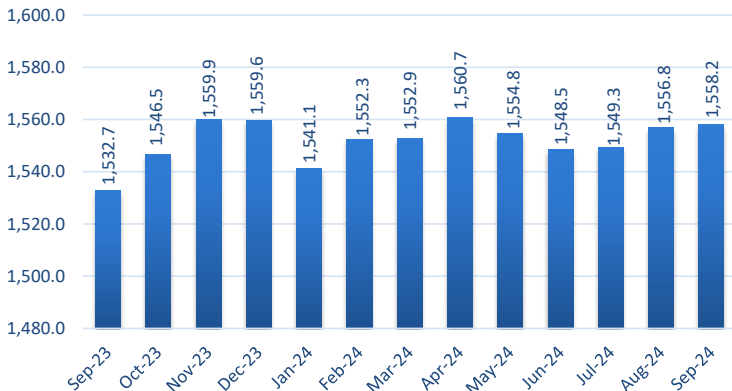


Tampa's total nonfarm payroll employment was among the largest over-the year job gains in the state of Florida adding 25,500 new jobs for a gain of 1.7% since September 2023. Other Florida metros with the largest gains were Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+28,200 jobs, +2.2%) and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+21,100 jobs, +2.3%). Industries gaining the most jobs in Tampa over last year include education and health services (+9,000), trade, transportation, and utilities (+4,200) and construction (+3,100). Professional and business services, trade, transportation, and utilities, and education and health services currently account for 53% of the industry share. In the past five years, employment in the Tampa MSA grew 10.5% - more than the state of Florida and the nation.

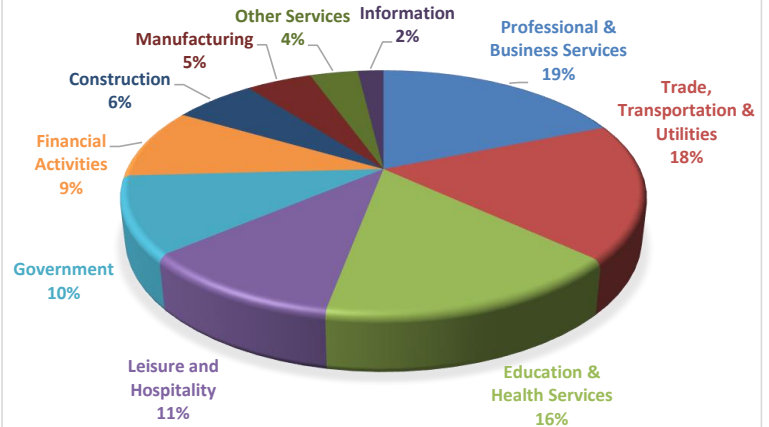
TAMPA MSA INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT YOY



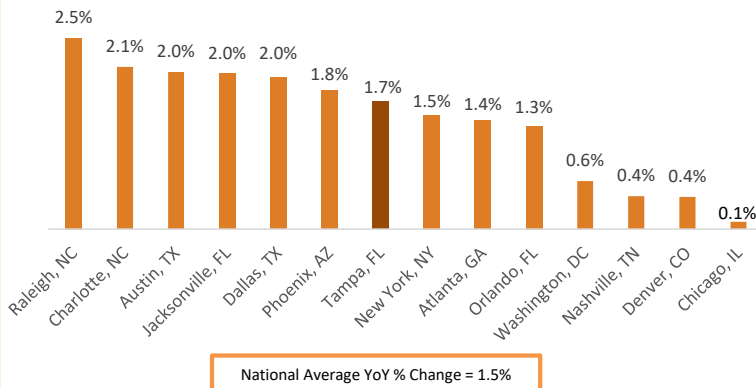
Monthly Total Nonfarm Employment Trend (000)
